BEGINNERS TRAINING COURSE

Don is keen to make the course interesting. Participants will start making a simple segmented bowl, like the Jarrah bowl in the picture overleaf. They can then progress to a more complex one by incorporating a feature ring like the one in the photo. Don will make up several sets of kits for participants to assemble themselves as a first step. Later he will deal with design, either by computer programs or hand drawing on graph paper, and how segments are cut and cramped into rings.

At the first training meeting Don will explain the kits he has made up and will demonstrate how to assemble one of them.
