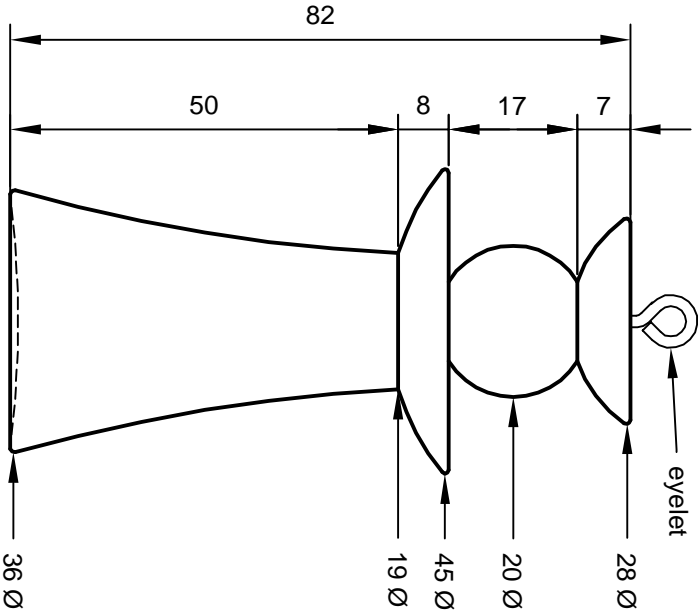
# ANGEL ORNAMENT

SCALE: Drawn to full size  
All dimensions are in millimetres  
(Check printer settings to ensure full size printing.)

## TURNING NOTES

- Turn a 50mm diameter x 100mm blank between centres using a live Stebcentre in the tailstock (the indentations will give a feature to the top of the halo).
- Form a dovetail spigot on the headstock end and mount in the chuck.
- Drill a 1.5mm hole 5mm deep into the head (tailstock end), for the brass eyelet.
- Using a parting tool turn the halo down to ≈3mm from the Stebcentre marks.
- Turn the head using a parting tool and skew chisel.
- Cut into the body to form the "wings".
- True up the tailstock surface of the wings.
- Using a skew chisel shape the headstock side of the wings.
- Shape the body using a roughing gouge & skew chisel.
- Part off using a skew chisel to ensure a concave base.
