

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### February, 1988

Northern Machinery, Balcatta, will be bringing Woodturner, Mike Smith, to Western Australia and he will be at the March meeting of the Association on both Saturday, and Sunday, also at Northern Machinery on Monday, and Tuesday of the following week.

Greg tells me they will be putting up a large marquee in front of the premises for the meeting and I expect this will be one of the bigger meetings yet held in the metro area.

At the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING it was decided that the monthly competitions be continued until February, and then the committee is to decide whether or not the competitions would continue. At the Nanga meeting there were more entries than we have had in the past few months and the indications are that there will be more again at Bunbury. It has been suggested that we would get more benefit from the competition if it was judged by an independent judge, who would be asked to give his constructive criticism of the entries. We have decided to have a competition at the March meeting, and this will be an opportunity to have an experienced turner from interstate as a judge.

My feeling with regard to the monthly competition is that they should continue as in the past with an independent judge where possible. I do believe that by members judging the competition and searching for faults in took work, design and finish makes you more critical of your own woodturning and I feel has done much to improve the general standard of our woodturning. Even if the number of entries is small, the benefits to the general membership is great.

Whilst on the subject of your Committee, remember, we are here to serve you, the Members of the Association, so if you have any suggestions or constructive criticism, please tell a committee member, even better, put pen to paper. At the last COMMITTEE MEETING we decided to appoint a property officer to keep track of Association equipment and Digger Constant has agreed to accept the job - THANKS DIG !!

We also decided that the Committee would purchase equipment to be used at Association meetings, group meetings and exhibitions/sales of work held by the Association.

There has been much discussion at recent Committee Meetings with regard to purchase of equipment.

In the past, our purchases have been fairly small - cups and other catering equipment, our very useful P A System and a card index system for our membership records. We have decided to purchase some quality video tapes to be available to groups and for use at Association meetings.

NB: I would like to see the Association purchase a lathe, another suggestion has been a bandsaw which although I dò not see any great benefit to the general membership, I do not and would not, oppose this purchase. Other items suggest for consideration are:

- \* Band saw mill as demonstrated at Nanga Dwellingup Meeting

If you, the members, feel, as I do that the membership fees should not be raised to cover the cost, then the shopping centre exhibitions and sale of work run by the Association as in the past are an excellent way to raise the money from outside the Association members pockets







## FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO ACCIDENTS -




