As it has being about 50 years since I was in the town it was interesting to see some of the major changes. The virtual demise of the timber

industry and the railway has had the most impact, counteracted by the growth of the wine industry and today there are supermarkets and two main streets. The Town Hall was dedicated in 1961 and plenty of parking for guests.

- Nov . . Hanging Christmas Decorations, Set of Four. Upside down Finial type. Not necessarily matching, colouring is optional.
- Dec . . Best Turned Item made in 2009 that has not been previously judged at an Association Workshop.
- Jan . . No workshop.
- Feb . . Natural Edged Bowl with a Lid. The lid to be set inside the bowl away from the natural edge.

Dust Extraction

With any woodwork, dust is a health problem and with woodturning is a serious problem, in particular when

sanding a finished piece. At Weekend workshops, demonstrators have been asked to keep sanding to a minimum – even not 'finish' a piece at all.

In the home workshop with a smaller area, it becomes critical. The following series of

photographs is one set-up to reduce the hazard. Fitting such a set-up to some lathes may present a problem, even a stand-a-lone system may be the answer. The intention here is to provide ideas that hopefully,

allow members to consider the problem and may be, improve on !!
