

#### I HOPE HEAVEN IS VERY MUCH LIKE THIS

I found myself returning one night to the workshop, to sit, to feel, to be surrounded by the sights and smells and feelings of a workshop. This was my time to take in the smells of paint and shavings, the glue and tools, which were always there, but remain unnoticed during the day.

There was a satisfaction of work completed and yet to be completed. It was an alone time, not a lonely time, for the obligations of the workshop had been fulfilled for the day. So, I sat alone, with only one small light I have at the back of the bench switched on, and felt deeply of what is the workshop. Here I am completely at home, at rest, at peace. The familiarity and understanding of every tool, every piece of wood, even the scraps below the saw and bench, is complete. I can turn, and at my fingertips are things I need to fulfill my dreams.

#### UNCLE GERALD'S FAVOURITE FINISH FORMULA

At the WAWA Workshop meeting in July, hosted by Midvale, the last item on the programme was a debate on FINISHES which generated a lot of response and interest from the audience. At the end of the event there was a handout, by Gerald Young, on his views and methods of finishing. Sadly, there were not enough to go around and a promise was made to have it included in the newsletter. So, Here it is!

A good finish starts while shaping the wood. Heavy cuts cause "tear out"....to be avoided particularly On final cuts. Finish with very light cuts, preferably **shear** cuts.

#### SANDING

- 1....Start with the finest grade that is effective (180 grit?) depending on your final turning cut smoothness.
- 2....Go through all the grades up to 400 (600?) DO NOT MISS A GRADE!
- 3....Clear the abrasive frequently to avoid clogging the grit, otherwise it won't cut well. A toothbrush is good for this task.
- 4....Finish with the lathe stationary—rubbing along the grain.
- 5....Dust off residue and abrasive particles before going on to the next finer grade.

#### **SEALING**

- 1... Seal with a thin coat of shellac.
- 2....Allow each coat to harden, then sand back to the wood with the grade of paper used for the final cut, ( along the grain where possible ).
- 3....The shellac is hard enough to sand back when it does not clog the paper. ( A matter of judgement and temperature ).
- 4....This procedure fills the grain—continue until you have reached a satin smooth feel.

#### **PENETROL**

- 1....Using a cloth, apply Penetrol oil generously to the wood. A fine brush may be needed for fine detail. Keep adding more oil with an oil-damp cloth to cover spots or areas that dry more quickly than the main body. DO NOT ALLOW TO GO STICKY. Two minutes or so should do it.
- 2....Vigorously rub off all surplus oil on the wood surface until the only oil left is in the pores of the wood.
- 3...Leave it to harden (overnight?)...8 hours at least...then buff.
- 4....Repeat the above until satisfied. The more coats, the shinier the finish.
- 5....If you have done the sanding well, there should be no more need for more abrasive treatment.
- 6....If you want a satin (non-gloss) effect, use 600 wet and dry paper along the grain, wetted with Penetrol, immediately dried off with a cloth.

Alan, in his demo introduced us to the French Curve template of mathematically generated curves which can be purchased from Jackson's Art Supplies and is definitely on my shopping list as a useful aid.

Fred LAURITSEN was one of nature's gentlemen, ever ready to help and advise anyone who requested assistance.


