Tom Brixey took the stage to show us how to turn a fish on a lathe. He first passed around two fish as examples of unique items that can be made using offset turning and hand work with a Dremel.

He constructed the fish in two parts and after cutting the fins with a coping saw, paper glued the pieces together. After turning, he split the joints. Tom then turned a potato and cut it into chips. The fish was then filleted to make a Fish & Chip meal.

Tom kept the audience guessing what the outcome was going to be right up to when he plated up the meal.
