After explaining the type of work in which she specialized, Trish passed round several examples of her embellishing, which included bottle shapes, platters and bowls.

Trish showed the types of brushes and paints she uses, and the way to clean and store them. Explaining how the pattern is marked out, she then showed the basic brush strokes of a comma and "C". Trish then painted patterns of roses and leaves on platters and bowls.

A lively question and answer session followed, and as there was still some time remaining, the audience called for an encore.

Trish obliged by painting a bowl with a gum nut pattern on the outside and leaves and gum nuts on the inside.

Whilst this was drying, she took a bowl with a pattern traced on the bottom and coloured the background with white highlights and left it to dry. Trish then went back to complete the bowl with flowers, and finally added leaves to the bottom of the other bowl.

Trish finished her demonstration by decorating a gum nut. Congratulations to Trish Ramsey for a very interesting demonstration and also to Bunbury for daring to do something different.
